SCHOOL UPDATE

Year 3 took part in a 10-week **Samba course** with Dorset Music Service. It was wonderful to see how much progress they made in that time and their ability to focus and concentrate was fantastic. They performed a sample of their learning for their families, who also got a chance to participate!

Dorset Reading Partners continue with their amazing work supporting children reading in school. We appreciate all that they do to engage the children and to promote a love of reading, which will hopefully stay with them for a lifetime.

Year 4 children enjoyed a trip to **St Michael's for a Sports Festival**. They had great fun and had plenty of opportunity to practise and hone their newly acquired skills.

In Maths we are continuing to focus on **Mastering Number** and staff are having training on this. We expect this to have a big impact on the children's deep understanding of numbers in the Early years of school.

In Science, Mrs Cuff has been part of the **Enthuse training programme** which will carry on for some time. This is already having a positive impact, especially in terms of investigations.



SCIENCE UPDATE FROM MRS CUFF

Hayeswood and Colehill are currently taking part in a STEM Enthuse project to help raise the profile of Science. This is for the teaching staff and pupils. Mrs Cuff leads this and attends half termly meetings where she meets all of the Science leads in the Trust to discuss the progress of the project and our next steps. We've recently delivered training to all staff on Working Scientifically which was a hands-on workshop in the October inset day. Staff then had the opportunity to implement these investigations into their planning. The next steps for the project is to look into having ambassadors in to discuss their job role and how it links to Science to show to the children that Science goes beyond being a Scientist! We also have the national Science Week in March 2024 which is being planned as we speak! The HSA has kindly offered to fund an exciting opportunity for all of our children so keep your eyes peeled for more news closer to the time!

I have been popping into lessons, looking at plans and talking to the children about their learning. I was impressed with the children's technical vocabulary and clear progression throughout the years. Mrs Radford continues to do a sterling job in supporting the children and staff at Colehill with her musical skills, not only does she take the weekly singing assembly, encouraging the children's love of song through performances such as Harvest and Christmas, but she also offers precious CPD (continuous professional development) opportunities to the teachers by demonstrating progressive lessons in each year group on a rota basis. Mrs Radford also teaches individual piano lessons across both schools. Hayeswood are now lucky enough to have Mrs Murray supporting them weekly with singing assembly and before school music club. She has been enthusiastic and inspirational in leading our singing for the Twinning Event at the Allendale Community Centre, Harvest and Christmas. From Spring term onwards, Mrs Murray will be helping to develop the children's and teacher's technical, constructive and expressive musical understanding through delivering lessons across the year groups.

In the New Year, I will continue to coordinate a program of community events, so far the children have enjoyed some wonderful live music courtesy of the talented Canford school students, the evening community event at the Allendale centre and the walk up to the church for Harvest. I am currently in communication with a local care home who are eager to see and listen to our young singers perform. Finally, in order to ensure that our provision is diverse and values all musical styles, genres and traditions, I will be looking to invite staff, parents and other outside agencies in to perform to, or with, our children.
